EN LÅNG UTRAGEN OLYCKSHÄNDELSE

Through its uniquely shaped narrative, drawn out in whimsical animation, this film invites us to bear witness to the emotional struggle of a nuclear family. It is a subtle but decisive reminder of the scary dysfunctionality of family that often promises to keep us safe. As the young protagonist struggles with too much responsibility, we witness how he carries the burden of his parents's obstacles and we become fully immersed in his anxiety as a child. The quirky humour is embellished gracely with humor to balance and counter the dark and disturbing content.

PINK RIDER

Director: Daniel Aguirre

This film is resourceful and refuses to let obstacles or challenges prevent the filmmaker from making his experiences vivid and his dreams won't be deterred. In its truly DIY spirit of filmmaking - it captures the ability to show experiences and aspirations through film forms. Using all the means of production available the film unmistakably emerges out of necessity to capture one's own personal journey and to own one's story. We were impressed by the narrative's political connections, its social observation of Swedish society - reflected with humour and lightness. In achieving this balance it shows great promise and a budding skill which we would like to recognise and support.

MADAM YOU MADE MY DAY

We want to give this film a special mention because it captures the absurdity of the rules of our society that has normalised how our bodies are subject to scrutiny and probed by security. It reminds us not to lose our sense of humor in these challenging circumstances and the importance of not taking ourselves too seriously in moments when we might not be understood clearly. Life is confusing when the security check booth is no longer a body scan but a moment to dance in the enclosed vitrine amidst the bemused expressions of security workers.
